A WORD FROM PASTOR JIM




FIRST PEOPLE: BOB MASTERS

Bob Masters is someone we would all be happy to get to know. Bob, 98 years old, has been a member for over 60 years at Perrysburg First and gladly calls us his home. Recently, through the Library of Congress Veterans History Project, Bob was interviewed by the Way Public Library as a veteran of World War II, and his memories were published in the Perrysburg Messenger. His full story is full of his recollections of extraordinary events during his time of service, and we're retelling the highlights.

Bob served in the U.S. Navy, holding office posts from the time he enlisted. After boot camp, Bob put in for sea duty and, following a 5-day trip by train to San Francisco, he sailed to Pearl Harbor and reported to the naval station for training in radar and night offensives. From there he served in the office aboard the first fighting aircraft carrier, the Saratoga, and then assisted the admiral on the Enterprise, which saw action in the Pacific region. During his two years overseas, Bob survived kamikaze attacks and a bomb that hit ten feet below where he was on the flight deck, but it didn't explode. His return to San Diego was momentous as he arrived on the first battleship that docked there after the war had ended, just days after Japan surrendered. The ship was met with loud celebration, "whooping and hollering for two days," Bob explains, and they were met with celebrity media attention.

If you visit Bob, he can share his personal experiences and fill your imagination with his story. He'll tell you that learning shorthand in high school was an unusual circumstance but led to his appointments in office posts in the Navy. You might hear him honor the bravery of sailors in action. 


these faith skills around, wherever they go, for the rest of their lives. Then they can go with confidence because they have the faith skills needed for whatever comes their way.

Troop 198 Update.

Mr. Liam Gail, a life scout of Troop 198, has completed his Eagle Project which was the restoration of Wood County Parks Garden Boxes.

Per Mr. Gail: "For my Eagle Project I worked with the Wood County Parks to restore several of their native plant garden boxes. After working with mentors to engage in fundraising in the community from neighbors, business owners, and family, I raised the necessary money to purchase all the materials necessary for the project. I successfully raised enough money to build 5 garden boxes. This project cost \$1,100.00. This project was completed on March 23rd and March 29th. I led a group of 5 scouts from both Troop 198 and Troop 219 in the construction process. We gathered at the Wood County Parks Nursery Building and worked with their supervisor to determine which garden beds were in greatest need of replacement. These beds are important because they help with conservation in our community and local parks......
